Instructions for Use:

If the student is using traditional high school materials to study a foreign language, this checklist will likely be unnecessary. However, for those students who are putting together a program using a variety of sources, or who are studying via immersion, these lists will be helpful in determining what constitutes a year of foreign language study in a high school setting. Whether the student is applying for an Academic Honors Diploma or not, the award of a credit is earned based on any of the criteria listed in the diploma guide.

Candidates for the Academic Honors distinction must include each of the topics in Level 1 and Level 2 to some extent in their course of study.
